

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

Option 2 – Central Pavilion – Concept drawings






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


Option 2 – Central Pavilion – Concept drawings Ground Floor

	Football West	Football West supports the CoB Priority 1 of increasing sports space and playing fields within the Dunsborough Sub-District. After considering the two options presented, Football West prefers Option 2 of the Central Pavilion as this aligns with the stated preferences of Dunsborough Towns FC. This also provides convenient accessibility to the playing fields and an improved participant/spectator experience. The central pavilion also does not reduce the amount of active playing fields from the original proposal. Option 2 provides more change rooms, referees rooms, office, and social space than Option 1. These spaces are all areas of strategic importance for inclusive facilities that are fit for purpose. Dunsborough Basketball Club

Question 1

If Option 2 goes ahead re-design to reduce cost and use that \$\$ on building two indoor courts and storage on the yellow sand space? These courts would use the ablution etc facilities of Option 2.

Response

Latest cost estimates to build 3 indoor courts to a similar standard to those currently at the GLC is approximately \$14 million.

Question 2

Option 2 as it stands is too far away from the court sports. Move back and to the right (as you are looking at it)

Response

Question 3

Opportunity for L-shaped pavilion?

Response

Currently we have been directed by Council to present the 2 options. Any variations can be taken into account dependent on the feedback received from all Clubs.

Question 4

Opportunity for double storey pavilion for Option 1?

Response

Subject to budget this can be a consideration again subject to feedback from all Clubs

Question 5

Opportunity for COB to provide and install storage for hard court clubs if Option 2 proceeds?

Response

This has always been a consideration noting that the original pavilion design had been scoped down due to budget constraints and did not include as much storage as originally requested by the clubs. This can be reconsidered at detailed design stage.

Question 6

Timeframe for additional courts if Option 2 proceeds?

Response

Work currently being conducted to review the future of the Geographe Leisure Centre will likely inform this.

Question 7

Can an environment study be completed on the bushland reserved previously for additional courts before Option 2 proceeds to determine if additional courts on this land is in fact a viable option?

Response

Environmental studies of flora and fauna generally take 3 years.

Question 8

Would the City be happy to present Option 1 to Councillors should 3 out of the 4 other Sporting Organisations vote it as their preferred option. Does it need to be a 100% majority?

Response

A recommendation will be made to Council taking into account all feedback from all Clubs. This will be a public report and can be viewed and discussed prior to it going to Council for a decision.

Dunsborough Cricket Club

General comments on DCC/DJCC place in the greater Dunsborough sporting community

DCC through its active engagement in the CoB processes around the new (and old) playing facilities has tried to maintain a position on achieving "the greater good for the entire Dunsborough sports community". This collegiate attitude has not been shared by some other sporting clubs which is a shame. By actively engaging with the process we feel we have been able to contribute to progressing the cause of sports other than ours (ie AFL, Basketball). The Dunsborough Towners have been abrasive and deliberately and intentionally unengaging or unwilling to attend many sessions designed to achieve compromise. To now have the CoB provide a much more expensive option (option 2) which will further delay the move is unhelpful and unwanted. We would advise the CoB that our suggestion is to move forwards with the users who have done what has been requested of them. Further users can also use these facilities but have made no attempt to constructively engage and therefore must now be left behind. Clearly, the Towners will be co-users of a \$4m facility but have foregone their place in the planning process by their ownchoosing.

In summary Dunsborough Cricket Club juniors & seniors are in complete favour of Option 1 as we feel this location will suit cricket and other court sports the best at the new DLSP, as Option 2 will be to a detriment to the same sports not to mention the delay in construction & green space activation along with excessive & unwarranted costs for Option 2. Cricket would need to have sole lease for the 6 months during the summer season and a similar management set up like we currently have in place at DPF. We would also like to acknowledge that we have been very grateful that the COB is constructing the sporting groups this new precinct and the difficulties that go with that, which is why we have always been open and engaging to get the best outcome for all sports not just our own.

Dunsborough Towns FC (DTFC) (Including Option 3 as alternative)

Further questions from Cob following Dunsborough Towns FC feedback so officers and Councillors can better understand the situation:

- 1. Can you please explain in detail what you mean by "operations of our Club" and how option 1 is not suitable for these operations? Regarding the summer months, can you please detail what summer soccer activities you refer to and what matches your club intends to participate in during summer; and
- 2. Can you please detail your reasoning behind why your club "cannot agree to a management committee" model to manage the pavilion?

Response DTFC (13/12/2023)

We, at the Dunsborough Town Football Club (Soccer), appreciate the opportunity to share additional insights regarding the proposed options for the pavilion and football/soccer fields.

Firstly, we acknowledge and appreciate the needs and aspirations of the other sporting clubs in Dunsborough. While our primary focus is to provide feedback from the perspective of our club and its needs, the majority of our club members also participate in various sports within our community. We support the growth and development of all clubs and aim for an inclusive sporting environment.

Our club's existing facilities, built with private funding, adequately meet the majority of our club and code's needs. If given a choice, we would prefer to remain in our current location. However, recognising the need for other clubs' growth and additional space, we advocate for fair treatment for football/soccer in any facility relocations. Our hesitation stems from concerns that relocating to facilities unsuitable for our code's progression will certainly impede its growth.

1. Response to Option 1 vs Option 2:

Regarding Option 1 (northern location), while appreciating the proposed concept, we believe the location inhibits our club's operations due to several critical factors. The pavilion's position in Option 1 significantly limits spectator visibility of the pitch, hindering engagement, growth and potential revenue generation, contrary to our club's growth objectives. It is also an unsafe location for spectators to gather behind the goals. As such, it is rare to see a pavilion in such a location for a football/soccer sporting facility.

Conversely, Option 2 (mid oval location), despite its ambition and expense, offers a more strategically favourable location. It is the location of the pavilion in option 2 that is important. The pavilion's placement in Option 2 facilitates greater connectivity and accessibility to the game, supporting our club's growth and nurturing the football/soccer community.

2. Essential Pavilion and Green Space Requirements:

To ensure our club's sustainability and vibrancy, we emphasize the pivotal elements necessary for both the pavilion and green space. These include adequate viewing areas,

functional canteen facilities, pitch usage and pitch orientations optimised for spectator viewing during matches undertaken across our wet/windy winter weather season.

Similar to other user groups, the football/soccer club will not be in a position to relocate to DLSP until the permanent pavilion and lights are installed, as moving prior to this would be a major risk to our operations and future.

Pavilion requirements:

- 4 change rooms, and adequate public ablutions etc
- Kitchen/bar and connected social area, ideally closely connected to outside and as close as possible to the halfway line of the main pitch.
- Adequate storage spaces
- The ability to maintain our current arrangements for 6-month leases that alternate with cricket.

Green space requirements:

- Pitches running north-south (due to the sun)
- During the Winter season pitches for training and game days (7 days a week)
 - o Full size FIFA pitches, (Senior/Youth/U13/14/15)
 - Three guarter size pitches (U10/11/12)
 - Half size and miniroos size pitches (U6/7/8/9)
 - Lighting is required to all pitches
- During the summer season access to 1 FIFA size pitch for offseason and preseason activities, including the ability to run a summer social competition in Dunsborough. (2 nights a week and one day per weekend)

3. Summer Football/Soccer Activities:

During the summer months, our club engages in various football/soccer-related activities critical for player development and community involvement. These activities range from pre-season training and practice matches to national competitions and initiatives aimed at fostering community engagement through football:

Current Summer requirements:

- Pre-season training runs from December to March.
- Off season training also continues between September and December
- Pre-season practice matches begin in January
- DTFC academy training and inter regional match 11v11 (junior girls and boys)
- Australia Cup (National competition from February each year Full size pitch)
- Perth Glory Men's and Women's Preseason training and showcase events.
- Football West training hub and talent support program (all year round)
- Season launches (from March onwards)
- Christmas Football Event
- Club come and try events (periodically throughout summer months)

Future Summer requirements:

- A summer social competition:
 - Summer series football (football fives, social football, 7v7seniors)
- Walking football (inclusive activity)
- Cantoni Cup (inclusive event) teams training (Oct/Nov)
- Female football program summer series (juniors and seniors)
- Dads and daughters Football

4. Reasoning Behind Management Committee:

Our club advocates for exclusive use of the pavilion due to the specific operational needs essential for our sustainability. We firmly believe that a management committee might compromise our ability to meet these requirements effectively and efficiently.

5. Concerns Regarding Proposed Development at Existing Dunsborough Playing Fields:

Expressing concern about the proposed development that seemingly supports one single sporting code with specific fenced-in facility requirements, we are cautious about being compelled to relocate hastily. We believe that expedited installation of an unfunded multi-million-dollar development should not lead to the inadvertent displacement of other sporting codes.

6. Solution Focused Approach - "Option 3":

We have gone ahead and reviewed the feedback from the three other user groups that will potentially use the DLSP facilities and offered an "option 3" that we feel addresses many of the individual club's requirements. Please see attached table and concept drawings. We propose that the COB and other relevant users consider this as alternative that can be developed in a collaborative way.

In conclusion, the Dunsborough Town Football Club is committed to collaborative engagement and finding mutually beneficial solutions. We believe that through open

dialogue and compromise, a favourable resolution addressing the concerns of all stakeholders, including our club's unique needs, can be reached.

We trust that this feedback provides valuable insights into the complexities and concerns surrounding the DLSP development. We appreciate the COB's attention to our club's perspective and eagerly anticipate further discussions for the betterment of the entire Dunsborough community.

Key features of Option 3 concept:

- Simple design and layout = cost effective (less than the proposed fees for option 1 and option2)
- Located between option 1 and 2 sites as a compromise to meet more needs or more users utilising an L-shaped building.
- Raised 600mm for better viewing and seating option right around building
- 2 separate indoor social spaces allowing for 2 users in each season (option to add a second kitchen if financially viable)
- Toilets centralised for whole site and general public access.
- More dedicated storage space with options for each club to have dedicated space, including a separate shed for cricket equipment
- 3 Large covered areas for weather protection of spectators
- Can very simply be added to in the south and north directions in the future
- Room for 3 extra hard courts (netball, basketball), and no immediate need to stretch the green space east.
- Similar size footprint as option 1 (600m2) + simpler design + more storage + second social space = all cheaper than option 1(\$4mill)

Dunsborough Cricket Club

Received 18/12/23 – in response to Option 3

After looking at "Option 3" as sent in by soccer DCC feels that this concept is the worst out of the "3" options that are available at the DLSP. "Option 3" would be even more of an imposition to cricket and even more divide the clubs operations.

To be honest DCC feels this is all too little too late as soccer have had plenty of time to compromise or come up with other suitable options over the last 2 years instead of sitting on their hands the whole time. We are not even sure why the COB is even asking for feedback or considering "Option 3" when every other club has done the right thing and followed the process. We would have loved to give the COB other options and have on many of occasions throughout this DLSP process not just the pavilion but have been shut down.

DCC remains adamant that Option 1 is the preferred location for the new pavilion and we feel that other user groups are becoming jaded by how this pavilion process is playing out due to a small portion of the potential user groups.

Received 21/12/23 - in response to Option 3

Thank you for the opportunity to give feedback again.

The L shape was an option that Netball asked if it could be investigated and was told at the meeting this wasn't an option. The drawing that Soccer have provided and the information only suite Soccer again and no consideration other than L shape building for Court Sports. Indoor Social Space will not meet Netball's requirements we have 270 – 300 or more members, does not give netball kitchen facilities which we require. We would like to hold fundraisers, functions, grading day and club carnivals which will use the canteen facilities. Decent storage space is definitely requirement for Netball currently we have all our equipment etc stored between 4 houses.

As stated at the meeting more courts on that space that is currently vacant will not happen for many years to come and by than we would hope that indoor courts would be considered in Dunsborough. If that land is kept vacant it will course more of an issue for court sports as we will have sand constantly on the courts.

Also, the statement below made by Soccer:

"In conclusion, the Dunsborough Town Football Club is committed to collaborative engagement and finding mutually beneficial solution. We believe that through open dialogue and compromise, a favourable resolution addressing the concerns of all stakeholders, including our club's unique needs, can be reached."

This statement unfortunately can only happen if Soccer are willing to provide a different representative to attend meetings. All previous meetings have shown that we cannot meet with the current soccer representative as it turns into a very uncomfortable meeting, very intimidating and soccer only listening to what they want. We need a representative from Soccer that will listen to other codes without interrupting, also without starting an argument with the Shire.

DLGSC

Received 09/01/24 - in response to Option 3

As discussed, in reviewing this latest option consideration should be given to the overall reduction of playing space within the Dunsborough Sub-district. The Department recommends that any proposed reduction in playing space at Dunsborough Lakes Sports Precinct the department should be reviewed in an updated needs assessment so the City can consider how the needs of the Dunsborough Sub-District has changed since the CSRFF application in 2020 which included a needs assessment identifying this amount of space was required for the ongoing needs of the sub-district.

An updated needs assessment should be provided as part of any decision to reduce available playing space and it's recommended that the Department is provided a copy of this needs assessment and decision.

In regard to the covered viewing areas, the Department sees these infrastructure components as low priorities when assessing as part of the Community Sport and Recreation Facilities Fund (CSRFF). See link "What We fund" https://www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au/funding/sport-and-recreation-funding/community-sporting-and-recreation-facilities-fund/what-we-fund

In addition this, the size of the social space is more aligned to what we see in a State level Facility and would also be considered as a low priority.

The Department, through the CSRFF, aims to increase participation in sport and recreation, with an emphasis on physical activity, through the development of sustainable, good quality, well-designed and well-utilised facilities. The Department's focus is on basic sporting infrastructure with priority consideration on projects that lead to facility sharing and rationalisation. Multi-purpose facilities reduce the infrastructure required to meet similar needs and increase sustainability and the program is not designed to provide facilities to meet a club's ambitions to compete in a higher grade.

I'm aware that this decision is having an impact on the installation of lighting infrastructure throughout the sports park, with \$169,796 of CSRFF allocated to completing this element of the sports park. The Acquittal of these funds was scheduled to be May 2024 and a request has been received to extend this acquittal out to 15 December 2024. Please be advised that further extensions may not be approved if the project is not showing some progression over the coming months given the City has advised that site works would be commencing by 1 August 2024.

Football West supports the Option 3 proposal given it meets the needs of Dunsborough Towns FC and the other users in a cost effective manner.

Sharks Dunsborough FC

Received 22/01/2024 - in response to Option 3

Option 3 appears to provide some alternatives that as presented by Soccer appear to meet many of the requirements presented by the other users, however the intent of these clubs behind their comments might not be what soccer has interpretated, so clarity needs to be sought from these clubs. There does however appear to be some good suggestions nevertheless. That said have the other clubs been offered the opportunity to present their own 3rd option? (*This question was responded to by Dave Goodwin:-Thanks for the feedback. We are still waiting for the costings on Option 3. Other Clubs have not been invited to submit their own options as this will significantly delay this project even further, Council specifically requested that we present 2 options for consideration.)*

As per our feedback on options 1 and 2, timing and budget are the two key elements from our of point of view as these two elements will have a direct impact on our access to the critically required additional green space at the Dunsborough playing fields. Our support still remains with the club members that are also members of all the clubs that will use this space; therefore ultimately Basketball, Cricket and Netball need to be fully supportive of option 3.

The layout of the green space, although not critical in the pavilion layout seemed a disadvantage to the juniors and their access to changerooms and facilities as a side note.

Dunsborough Basketball Club

Received 22/01/2024 - in response to Option 3

Our Club maintain that Option 1 is our preferred option.

Option 1

- Is better placed for most sporting groups
- Is where it is ready to be built NOW with all underground services
- Will be able to built to a budget
- Can be built in a reasonable time frame

Option 3

- Would be a very expensive option with so much perimeter of the building
- Cost will delay the project
- It isn't close to the current outdoor courts
- Makes for good provision for future indoor courts
- Small indoor social space and no kitchen near the court end
- Very large indoor social space on the soccer half way line

IF Option 3 were to be considered this large social space should be split evenly and 2 kitchens created, potentially the size of the building to be scaled down with Costings to be approved by CoB to allow the facilities to be built in a reasonable timeframe. That being said as stated our preferred option is Option 1.


Attachment 1Location Plan-DA23/0565 Lot 5 (60) Adelaide Street Proposed Single House (Outbuilding)-Special Control Area


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
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Terms of Reference

Committee: Airport Working Group

Responsible Directorate: Economic and Business Development Version: Draft

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The Airport Working Group (the 'Group') is established with the aim of providing a forum for considering issues and opportunities associated with Busselton Margaret River Airport (Airport) as well as providing a mechanism to facilitate consultation and cooperation between the Airport and relevant stakeholders including the wider community, aviation industry, tourism industry, business and government organisations.

2. OBJECTIVES

- 2.1 The objectives of the Group are to:
 - a. Monitor the financial and operational performance of the Airport;
 - b. Foster liaison and cooperation between the City of Busselton and stakeholders associated with the Airport;
 - c. Provide a forum for the discussion of issues, suggestions and recommendations on issues and opportunities associated with the Airport; and
 - d. Consult with the community, aviation, tourism, business and government organisations about operations, opportunities and impacts associated with the Airport and its activities.

3. MEMBERSHIP

- 3.1 The membership of the Group shall comprise the following:
 - a. Four (4) City of Busselton Elected Members
 - b. One (1) City of Busselton deputy Elected Member
 - c. Chief Executive Officer
 - d. Director Economic and Business Development
 - e. Manager Airport
- 3.2. In the event of a member being unable to attend a meeting the deputy member may attend in their place.
- 3.3. Membership of the Group shall, unless determined otherwise, cease on the day of the next ordinary Council election.

4. CHAIR

- 4.1. The Group shall appoint an Elected Member of the City as the Chair and Deputy Chair to conduct its business.
- 4.2. The Chair shall be responsible for the running of the meeting.

5. MEETINGS

- 5.1. The Group shall meet quarterly or as required but at least two times per year.
- 5.2. The Chief Executive Officer shall ensure meeting agendas are distributed to members with relevant attachments no less than three days prior to each meeting.
- 5.3. The Chief Executive Officer shall ensure that notes of the meetings are prepared and distributed to all members present at the meeting for their information within 14 days of the meeting. Notes shall record the outcomes of discussions, not the content of those discussions, and will be included in the Elected Member Information Bulletin for the following ordinary Council meeting.
- 5.4. If the members present at any particular meeting have any concerns with the notes prepared, they should advise the Chair or Chief Executive Officer (or their delegate) as soon as possible and in any case prior to the next meeting; and where that occurs the Chair shall ensure that the matter is resolved to the extent necessary and practicable at the next meeting, with the outcome to be reflected in the notes of that meeting.
- 5.5. The Group can request the Chief Executive Officer to prepare a report to the Council on a particular matter on the basis of a majority vote.

6. DELEGATED POWERS

6.1. The Group has been established by a decision of the Council and these Terms of Reference but does not have any delegated powers.

7. EVALUATION OF GROUP'S EFFECTIVENESS

- 7.1 At the meeting of the Group prior to the ordinary Council elections, the Group shall undertake a review to evaluate its effectiveness, and as a guide the following should be determined:
 - a. are the Group's purpose and objectives being met?
 - b. should the purpose and objectives be amended?
 - c. are the Group members regularly attending meetings?
 - d. review the Terms of Reference, including membership.

8. TERMINATION OF WORKING GROUP







This item was considered by the Finance Committee at its meeting on 25 Jul 2019 9.30am, the recommendations from which have been included in this report.

PRÉCIS

The Finance Committee is requested to acknowledge this report on a recent quotation for insurance options for the Busselton Jetty. Due to the concern around limited coverage from "actions by the sea" and the actual costs of premiums and excess, City staff have continued with the status quo to "self-insure" the Busselton Jetty.

Committee Recommendation and Officer Recommendation

That the Council notes this report and information received regarding the potential insurance policy for the Busselton Jetty and continues to "self-insure" the Busselton Jetty as per Council resolution C1306/158.

BACKGROUND

The City currently has a license agreement with the Department of Transport dated October 2009 for the construction and operation of the Busselton Jetty. Clause 11.2(b)(ii) of the agreement states:

"To the extent that it is commercially practical to do so and to the level of cover that is commercially realistic by reference to the funding and resources available, the Licensee will take out an appropriate insurance policy to the replacement or reinstatement of the Busselton Jetty against the Insured Risks to commence on the Date of Practical Completion of the refurbishment works..."

In June 2012, the City sought consideration by the DoT that the City "self-insure" the Jetty due to the fact that insurance options still did not cover adequately for damage caused by water through action by the sea, tidal wave or high water. Quotations that were received indicated an extremely high excess (up to \$6,000,000). The DoT responded in August 2012 advising that this would be acceptable. They also requested that they continue to be advised on future progress on the insurance situation.

Council considered a report specifically on the insurance of the Busselton Jetty in May 2013 and resolved (C1306/158):

That the Council:

- 1. seeks approval for self-insurance of the Jetty from the Department of Transport that includes an annual contribution to the Jetty Maintenance Reserve for that purpose.
- 2. includes in the 2013/14 budget an allocation of \$60,000 to the Jetty Maintenance Reserve with an annual CPI incremental increase for the purposes of self-insuring the jetty.

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3. adds the Busselton Jetty to the City's insurance scheme and seeks a formal valuation of the structure in the event that the Department of Transport rejects the City's proposal for self-insurance and uses the budget allocation for self-insurance for insurance premiums.

The DoT agreed to the then Shire's requests as per points 1 and 2.

In May 2014, the City sent correspondence to the Department of Transport notifying them that after seeking advice through its insurance broker, the City did not consider that it was commercially practical to take out an insurance policy for the replacement or the reinstatement of the Busselton Jetty.

As such the City has continued to allocate approximately \$60,000 per annum to the Busselton Jetty Insurance Reserve to insure against damage, rather than sign up to a specific policy.

The City has, over a number of years, continued to test the market via Local Government Insurance Services (LGIS), the results of which have shown that it has not been commercially viable to insure the jetty via means other than the status quo. City staff have once again requested LGIS to investigate the private market and consider an insurance policy for the Busselton Jetty.

STATUTORY ENVIRONMENT

The City of Busselton has a license for the erection, construction and maintenance for the Busselton Jetty from the DoT under section 7 of the *Jetties Act 1926*. The Jetty is constructed on Reserve 46715 which is Crown land reserved under section 41 of the *Land Administration Act 1997* for the purposes of "Recreation, Tourism and Heritage Protection."

The City of Busselton Jetties Local Law 2014 provides management and control of activities on the jetties as defined within the Local Law.

RELEVANT PLANS AND POLICIES

The Busselton Jetty is central to the Busselton Foreshore Masterplan.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The most recent advice in relation to the insurance of the Busselton Jetty indicates that LGIS could insure the Jetty under the current Property Scheme under the following conditions, particularly due to the type of asset:

- Assuming the liability of the Jetty is approximately \$60,000,000 (subject to a valuation);
- Included under the City's property schedule (Property Scheme);
- Standard annual aggregate of \$1,000,000 per Jetty for action by the sea;
- Total limit on all assets claimed (including Jetty) for any 1 event would be \$5,000,000;
- Jetty would be fully covered for earthquake, fire, cyclone, lightening etc;
- Annual contribution to add the Busselton Jetty would be \$78,000 plus GST;
- Subject to a minimum deductable excess of \$250,000; and
- On a short term arrangement to be re-assessed next year.

In summary, the most that the City of Busselton could claim for damage to the Jetty from action by the sea would be \$1,000,000 with a deductable excess of \$250,000. The value of the Jetty is estimated at around \$50,000,000, noting an appropriate valuation would need to be obtained to clarify this.

If the Busselton Jetty was damaged due to actions by the sea, it is highly likely that other jetties such as Quindalup, Dolphin Road etc. would also be damaged, along with a large amount of coastal

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infrastructure. As the maximum amount for any one event is \$5,000,000, it is probable that the City could still be at financial risk.

The current balance as at 1 July 2019 for the Jetty Insurance Reserve is \$365,698.

LONG-TERM FINANCIAL PLAN IMPLICATIONS

The current LTFP allows for transfers of the amount of \$60,000 per annum (indexed) to the Busselton Jetty Insurance Reserve annually for the life of the plan. These funds are able to be used for repairs to the Jetty should damage occur.

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY OBJECTIVES

This proposal aligns with and supports the **Council's Key Goal Area 6** – 'Leadership' and more specifically **Community Objective 6.4** – 'Assets are well maintained and responsibly managed'.

RISK ASSESSMENT

An assessment of the potential implications of implementing the officer recommendation, that is to continue to self-insure the Jetty, has been undertaken using the City's risk assessment framework.

The insurance proposal provided by LGIS is not considered to be an adequate treatment for this risk, as it will not, for the reasons outlined in this report, provide coverage which would adequately safeguard the financial risk to the City of an "action by the sea".

As outlined in the officer comment section of this report there are other risks associated with possible damage to the Jetty, primarily due to fire or damage as a result of impact from a water borne vessel, and the City not being able to adequately cover the costs of such damage. The risk of this is rated as medium (of major consequence but rare in terms of likelihood), and is expected to reduce over time as the City's Jetty reserve balances grow.

CONSULTATION

Correspondence with LGIS in relation to insurance cover has taken place over a period of time.

OFFICER COMMENT

The Finance Committee and Council has previously been provided with similar reports in relation to insurance of the Busselton Jetty. Scenarios were considered historically around the areas of risk for possible damage. These risks included usual insurable risks such as fire and damage from water borne vessels.

In a report to Council in June 2013, officers outlined the worst case scenarios of these types of risks. The report stated:

"In relation to fire risk, officers consider that the risk of fire damage is limited to the timber sections at the start of the jetty (Section 1, which is 150m long) and up to the Underwater Observatory (Section 7 which is 100m long). The fire would be unlikely to spread outside of these areas as the rest of the jetty deck is now concrete and the piles are in isolated lateral pairs, effectively removing the fire path along the length of the Jetty. In addition, Fire Management Plans are in place to cover the Jetty in event of a fire. A total loss of the timber sections would attract a replacement value of approximately \$1.8m per 100m. This equates to approximately \$2.7m for the Section 1 and \$1.8m for section 7. The inclusions for fire, debris, professional fees and additional reinstatement costs applied at the same rate as LGIS would lift costs to \$3.5m for Section 1 and \$2.3m for Section 7.

In relation to structural damage, the most likely scenario covered by the insured risk able to cause significant damage or destruction is impact from water borne vessels. The cost of replacement of the concrete deck sections of the jetty are approximately \$1.4m per 100m. The current construction of the Jetty is structurally independent meaning that only those damaged section/s and perhaps those adjacent would require repair. The worst case probable scenario considered during the review was if a large boat impacted the jetty destroying or significantly damaging 150m of the jetty structure. The total replacement of 150m would cost approximately \$2.1m and applying the same debris, professional fee and reinstatement costs as above would result in total costs in the vicinity of \$2.7m. It is considered that the likelihood of such an event occurring is relatively low. The proposed Jetty Local Law limits boating access to the Jetty which assists to reduce the risk."

The above information is still relevant today plus or minus CPI adjustments for construction costs.

Fire has previously been assessed as a tolerable and manageable risk, given the information documented above.

Seeing as "actions by the sea" are only covered up to a value of \$1,000,000 under the proposal from LGIS, and with a deductable excess of \$250,000, City officers are of the opinion that the proposal is not the most advantageous to the City.

The City's LTFP indicates that by 2029 the Jetty Insurance Reserve will reach a balance of \$1,340,000. As this reserve balance grows, so does the City's ability to adequately cover sections of the Jetty should damage be caused by a number of means, including wave action by the sea. While accepting the risks mentioned above, should the Jetty Insurance Reserve need to be accessed, it would also not jeopardise the financial caps put in place on the other jetty infrastructure within the City boundary.

CONCLUSION

Based on the fact that the option to insure under the LGIS Property Scheme would still provide limited cover for the Busselton Jetty, City officers have continued to maintain the status quo in in regards to self-insuring the Busselton Jetty. The Finance Committee is requested to note this report and that officers will continue to test the market via LGIS to continue to look for a commercially viable insurance solution.

OPTIONS

The Committee could request City staff to investigate further insurance options on a regular basis in preparation for the 2020/2021 financial year.





Q12 Do you feel overall that access to hired e-scooters benefits your business?







I regularly and frequently use the bike / pedestrian footpath in Geographe. If scooters are used appropriately I would prefer scooters remain, however ... There are serious safety issues around mixing the use of scooters with pedestrians. Safety concerns increase as the number of scooter trips increase and if not addressed will at some point lead to serious injury or death of a person. In my view, mixing unshielded pedestrians with vehicles capable of speeds greater than a fast walk (i.e. in effect placing metal moving at speed near to unprotected flesh) is never a good idea. Most of the scooter safety issues generally appear to be associated with a relatively small number of individuals of all ages whose risk tolerance level when

riding scooters on the footpath appears to be unlimited. These individuals appear to have an ever diminishing regard for the safety of pedestrians. The footpath now appears to be developing into a pseudo road where some riders feel entitled to go as fast as they possibly can without the restriction of cars and trucks. The safety concerns also extend to the roads. I've witnessed a group of 6 -7 scooters ride as a group spread out across both sides of the road stopping drivers from going about their lawful business. I'm also concerned at the random discarding of scooters and how they seem to be used to deliberately skid on and break up the ground along the non tarmac sides of the pathway. At a personal level my concern is with scooters silently approaching me from behind at speed. I only need to step to one side for whatever reason and I risk serious injury. My suggestion to address the safety concerns is to perhaps widen the footpath to make it truly dual use. This might involve separating pedestrian and vehicle tracks with a white line or physically - an imperfect solution but maybe a reasonable compromise.

During peak times this adds to the pressure and feedback we received from the public about parking on the foredshore. If not for the scooters there would simply be nothing on offer to them at all . There is bike hire available in Busselton but they currently require 24 hours notice - this does not work for tourism. The scooters are required as a minumum for both staff/ locals and tourists - I would love to see more facilities added to this as well. My experience as a pedestrian is that Bicycle riders, EScooter and ESkateboard riders are unaware of the rules relating to the use of these vehicles on pathways. None of these vehicles can be heard when approaching from the rear of a pedestrian. It is unusual to have someone on one of these vehicles either slow down or sound a bell warning of their approach from behind. It is common to see bicycles riding in tandem, no helmets and young children riding bicycles or EScooters unsupervised, travelling at excessive speed. The issue is one which has caused severe injuries to pedestrians and riders in WA and other states already, but after such incidents make it to page two of a newspaper the collective heads return to ground. Only those grieving a lost son or a relative in a wheelchair are left to remember. I see the problem as threefold -Education, Signage, Enforcement. On roads there is signage to guide, regulate and separate motor vehicle users. Even after a lengthy period of learning to drive and having to pass written and practical tests before being allowed to drive there is still signage to assist and regulate road users. Police are present as part of the enforcement of the myriad of rules. Then we turn to Bicycles, EScooters and ESkateboards on paths and shared paths; There is no education needed to purchase and use any of the three devices, The only signs to assist, guide and regulate (in Busselton) are occasional stencils advising "Share, Respect, Enjoy". Which is probably the case for users of these devices but NOT pedestrians. There is no enforcement. City Rangers do not have powers relating to vehicles with the exception of parking. Police are busy dealing with the many of their other core functions. Pathways and even shared pathways by their nature are not always visible to patrolling vehicles. So in summary, we have beautiful, shared pathways the City of Busselton has provided for which nobody needs education, training, or license to ride on. Fast moving vehicles share the space with slow moving pedestrians. There are no signs to regulate or educate users. There is a severe impairment to policing these pathways. A perfect recipe for disaster would not be a harsh description. It is time the City of Busselton completed the task of ownership and duty of care which is so lacking and so necessary, in addition to the construction of the many kilometers of pathways they have undertaken. Education; Signage; Regulation.

PLANNING REFORM UPDATE

This week, a number of changes to Western Australia's planning system will take effect. These changes have been many years in the making, are the subject of broad consultation and align with the National Planning Reform Blueprint. Amendments to existing legislative and regulatory provisions will provide streamlined approval pathways to support the delivery of housing. From 1 March 2024, the following changes to assessment pathways, planning policies and systems will be in force:

Development Assessment Panels (DAP)

- Most development proposals over \$2million in value can opt-in to be determined by a DAP. Community housing projects of any value can also opt to use the DAP pathway.
- There are now three panels Metro Inner, Metro Outer and Regional.
- Panel composition remains the same with three specialist members a Presiding, Deputy
 Presiding and Specialist Member and two nominated representatives from your Council.
 There is no impact from these reforms on your nominated Councillors. The terms of current
 specialist DAP members have been extended while recruitment of fixed-term, full-time
 members is finalised, which is expected to be complete in the coming weeks.
- There are no changes to processes for lodging DAP applications. Local government officers will continue to assess applications, prepare and submit Responsible Authority Reports where the applicant has selected the option of a DAP determination.
- DAP meetings will be live streamed. The DAP Secretariat will liaise with your planning team
 with regards to the logistics of each meeting. Agendas, minutes and links to watch the meetings

 received.
- The Planning and Development (Development Assessment Panel) Amendment Regulations 2024 can be downloaded from <u>legislation.wa.gov.au</u>. These amendments will be incorporated into the *Planning and Development (Development Assessment Panel) Regulations 2011* on 1 March 2024.

Significant Development Pathway

- The *Planning and Development Amendment Act 2023* has introduced a new provision that provides a permanent pathway for determination of significant development applications by the Western Australian Planning Commission.
- This new pathway is now open to development applications valued at more than \$20 million in the Perth and Peel regions, or over \$5 million in any other region. Development applications should be lodged directly with the Department. Planning assessments, referrals, public consultation and report preparation will be undertaken by the Department.
- The first step for applicants is a pre-lodgement discussion an <u>online form</u> is available to register interest in the pathway and commence the process. Applicants will have their application referred to relevant authorities – including the respective local government – and the statutory timeframe for determination is 120 days.
- Assessment of applications previously lodged under the Part 17 pathway will continue.

Applications determined by Local Government

 Where an application is lodged with the local government and the applicant has <u>not</u> selected determination by a DAP, the local government will be responsible for undertaking all processes associated with the assessment and determination of that development application regardless of the value or type of the development.

Local Planning Schemes

- Changes to the Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015 (LPS Regulations) clarify the required process for local governments to submit proposed local planning schemes, or scheme amendments, to the WAPC for consideration and the Minister for Planning for approval prior to advertising for public consultation.
- Other changes to the LPS Regulations include an amended definition of a 'basic amendment' to make explicit that this class of amendment does not require advertising.

Supporting Regulations

- The following regulatory changes support amendments to the *Planning and Development Act* 2005:
 - Lands Regulations Amendment Regulations 2024 to amend the definition of the R-Codes to include reference to planning codes in the *Metropolitan Redevelopment Authority* Regulations 2011 and Strata Titles (General) Regulations 2019.
 - Swan Valley Planning Regulations 2024 new Regulations for amending the Swan Valley Planning Scheme (as a result of changes to the LPS Regulations).
 - Planning and Development (State Planning Policies) Regulations 2024 and Planning and Development (Planning Codes) Regulations 2024 – two new sets of Regulations setting out processes and procedures for making, amending and repealing State Planning Policies, and Planning Codes.

New Website and Portal

- Visit <u>planning.wa.gov.au</u> for a one-stop-shop with simple information about the State's planning system, the various decision makers and their roles and responsibilities, consultation processes and access to a dedicated online portal for lodging and tracking of applications.
- Planning Online the portal that replaces FASTplan/ePlan is a more contemporary online solution to lodge planning applications, track progress through the assessment pathway and upload clearance of conditions of approval. The portal provides a user dashboard and a communication tool with planners and case managers from the Department. Details and guidance on how to access the portal can be found here">here.

We appreciate the convergence of a significant number of system changes that may impact your staff and customers and want to reassure you that officers from across the Department are available to assist. To that end, attached is a stakeholder pack to assist with your internal and external communications and provide links to key resources and help services.

The next tranche of planning reform will take effect over the coming weeks through publication and Gazettal of the revised R-Codes (including the Medium Density provisions). We are working with the Western Australian Local Government Association to schedule information sessions. The reform of the Western Australian Planning Commission and changes to planning delegations and approval requirements for single house dwellings will follow thereafter, effective from 1 July 2024.

Key Messages

The WA Government has reached a major milestone in its Planning Reform agenda, unlocking opportunities for more housing and access to different types of housing, in more locations. These latest initiatives are drawn from, and build on, the 2019 Action Plan for Planning Reform.

Much of the *Planning and Development Amendment Act 2023* and remaining parts of the *Planning and Development Amendment Act 2020* are now operational, reducing unnecessary red tape, improving efficiencies in planning processes and in decision-making to support the delivery of housing and other critical infrastructure.

Effective from 1 March 2024:

- Reforms to Development Assessment Panels (DAPs) will see:
 - o Three new panels Metro Inner, Metro Outer and Regional in operation.
 - Changes to eligibility thresholds for DAP applications mandatory thresholds have been removed and DAPs are now opt-in for most developments over \$2million in value and all community housing projects.
 - Schedule 1 fee increases apply for the DAP pathway.
 - Specialist membership will be subject to change with a recruitment process currently underway to appoint full-time, fixed-term specialist members. There will be no change to local government representation on DAPs.
 - New DAP website on <u>planning.wa.gov.au</u> with easier to access agendas and meetings papers and links to live stream the meetings.
- The new Significant Development Pathway becomes operational.
 - Projects valued at \$20million or more in the Perth metropolitan area and Peel region and \$5 million or more in regional areas can be lodged with the Western Australian Planning Commission for determination.
 - All applications will be referred to the respective local government authority.
 - A 120-day timeframe applies for determination.
 - Applications lodged under Part 17 will continue to be assessed for determination by WAPC.
- Planning Online
 - Launch of new website <u>planning.wa.gov.au</u> helping community members, applicants and stakeholders understand State planning processes.
 - Introduction of the Planning Online portal (accessible via the website above) simplifying lodgement and tracking of applications to be determined by the WAPC (or as delegated to the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage).

Where an application is lodged with the local government and the applicant has not selected determination by a DAP, the local government will be responsible for undertaking all processes associated with the assessment and determination of that development application regardless of the value or type of the development.

The next tranche of planning reforms will take effect over the coming weeks through publication and Gazettal of the revised R-Codes (including the Medium Density provisions), and from 1 July 2024 with the reform of the Western Australian Planning Commission and changes to planning approval requirements for compliant single house dwellings.







- 1) Hazards and Incidents are recorded in BJI's Safety Management Software program myOSH with City related Hazards or Incidents forwarded to the City through myOSH;
- Regular meetings held with the COB Interface Group on all Safety issues including Emergency Management, Mock Evacuations and Emergency Response teams;
- 3) BJI attends six monthly COB LEMC meetings;
- 4) BJI is audited by independent Auditors every second year for the Office of National Rail Safety Regulator to maintain Train Accreditation and also carries out internal audits every other year, with monthly Safety Inspections by WHS staff, Managers and Board members. COB Safety Staffer Brian McCarroll used to meet annually in January with BJI to review our Risk Management Plan and Register.
- 5) BJI has attempted to meet with the new COB Safety Team regarding its Risk Register and dual Risks it shares with the COB, but was advised that BJI is the PCBU.
