Matters to be discussed:

Covid Restrictions

DFES LSW has enacted its business continuity plans due to the increasing cases of Covid in the area. This means the following,

- o Face to face training and meetings are to cease
 - Includes, staff and volunteers from SES, VFRS and VMRS
- Brigade and Units to roster volunteers for equipment checks (Max 3)
- Any volunteer exhibiting signs of illness should advise leadership and get tested.
- After every incident members to clean all contact surfaces

Training

Due to the Covid restrictions all face to face training has ceased. DFES staff are currently working on training that can be done online via platforms like MS Teams.

This includes new member qualification training, skills maintenance, and skill refreshers. The Region has already put in place and trialled these methods in 2020 successfully.

Incident Response

It has been a very busy last few months with major incidents in the following local governments Augusta Margaret river, Busselton, Donnybrook Balingup, Manjimup and Bridgetown. Volunteers, staff and support agencies have all worked amazingly together during these challenging times. It was a first for the state to see 4 level 3 fires occurring at the same time. This put incredible strain on our resources state wide but with great commitment and resolve from volunteers and staff we got through reasonably well.

DFES Staff

The LSW region is facing a number of staff changes. Area Officer Leeuwin will have a new officer appointed in the next month, District Officer Nelson (Manjimup) is currently vacant and awaiting new appointment, 2 Bushfire Mitigation officers will be replaced in the next month and a new Volunteer Management Support Officer Ruth Jackson started with the region on Monday the 21st Feb.
