

MARKYT Community Scorecard

The City of Busselton commissioned a MARKYT® Community Scorecard to:

- Support a review of the Strategic Community Plan (SCP)
- Assess performance against objectives and key performance indicators (KPIs) in the SCP
- Determine community priorities
- · Benchmark performance





The Study

The City of Busselton commissioned CATALYSE® to conduct a MARKYT® Community Scorecard during June 2020.

Scorecard invitations were sent to 4,000 randomly selected households; 1,000 by mail and 3,000 by email.


584 randomly selected residents completed a scorecard reducing the sampling error to ±4.02 % at the 95% confidence interval.

The City of Busselton provided supporting promotions through its communication channels. A further 247 residents, 121 out of area ratepayers and visitors, and 66 Council affiliated respondents participated bringing the total to **1,018 respondents**.

As analysis of results showed significant differences between these groups, the main body of this report presents responses from the random sample of residents only. This is consistent with the approach adopted by other local governments.

The final dataset was weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile.

Data has been analysed using SPSS. Where sub-totals add to ±1% of the parts, this is due to rounding errors to zero decimal places.



MARKYT Industry Standards

CATALYSE® has conducted studies for 60+ councils. When councils ask comparable questions, we publish the high and average scores to enable participating councils to recognise and learn from the industry leaders. 



Value for money from rates

Challenges

- Rates are becoming unaffordable for some residents
- Infrastructure and services are perceived to be insufficient in comparison to the rates being charged
- Ratepayers feel they are subsidising services and facilities for tourists

Community Driven Actions

- 1. Manage finances more effectively, cut back on spending and avoid unnecessary debt
- 2. Allocate funding for infrastructure more equitably across different areas of the City
- 3. Don't commit large amounts of money to major projects (e.g. arts centre)
- 4. Consult more with ratepayers about where money should be spent

Community Voices

"Don't go over the top with rate rises otherwise we can't afford to live here."

"Taking care of residents - lower rates. Many residents feel their rates are too high and are not being spent most effectively."

"Keep rates at a reasonable level. Ensure that residents receive priority. Avoid over expenditure on marginal projects."

"Maintain a balance of service for those that live here and not just cater for the people that visit."

"Stop making "Busselton" the epi-Centre of the City of Busselton. The CoB rakes in a lot of money from Dunsborough surrounding areas in rates etc. and that money is disproportionately spent in Busselton. And stop targeting so-called improvements that benefit visitors, i.e. "prettying" the town centre of Dunsborough in order to make it appealing for visitors. The local residents deserve more."

"Please do not always put Busselton first on the list, all parts of the City of Busselton are important. Think about all the residents and facilities all over the Shire and for all the community. We are all important in whatever interests we choose to pursue."

"More emphasis on the wider city regions, Dunsborough to Wilyabrup. Not just Busselton itself. We don't need a 600 person auditorium when there is a perfect facility in Bunbury that is losing money. We need more sporting facilities in Dunsborough including a pool."

Discontinue excessive spending on infrastructure such as BEACH (arts and cultural centres, entertainment centres etc.) that will place ratepayers in a huge debt situation, that will result in excessively high rates for future generations. This [is] having [a] negative impact on Busselton being a great place to live and invest. Busselton will become a high cost city and people will not be able to afford living here."



Coastal area management

Challenges

- Opposing views.
- Some discuss a lack of beachside amenities and attractions
- Others are concerned with over-development of the Busselton foreshore and jetty area and the need to better maintain and protect the natural coastline

Community Driven Actions

- 1. Opposing actions are recommended:
 - Continue with the foreshore redevelopment
 - Stop the foreshore redevelopment
- 2. Measures to protect the coastline from erosion e.g. building sea walls
- 3. Address build-up of excess seaweed on local beaches e.g. near Geographe Marina
- 4. Develop Dunsborough foreshore e.g. approval for a beachside Café / restaurant

Community Voices

"Focusing on the jetty and its vision for the future to be a community hub for locals and visitors."

"Continue to develop jetty area. Love what is happening.

Further restaurants along foreshore."

"I am keen to see the arts and cultural centre in Busselton go ahead and to encourage pedestrians and tourists to use the foreshore development."

"Stop spoiling the beachfront in Busselton (Jetty area) with buildings."

"Limit access to "City Centric" facilities such as breweries on foreshore. This area should be exclusively for families, not just tourist."

"No further development of the Busselton foreshore. It will make it over commercial and not enhance the lovely family atmosphere."

"Improve the preservation of beach area that recedes every year in storms."

"Management of the foreshore against degradation and erosion, and seaweed management. The excess seaweed around the city foreshore and jetty is very off-putting to visitors."

"Deal once and for all the ongoing seaweed mess near Geographe Marina."

"I think the City should think a bit more about Dunsborough.

Get the café built on the foreshore."

Community Voices

"Encouraging growth in industries to increase employment opportunities."

"Better partnerships between City and corporate partners."

"Look to future industry to keep our younger people here and employed, not just in the tourist sector."

"...should be fostering more high tech jobs, moving away from reliance on construction and FIFO jobs. It should be a state centre for renewable industry. It should leverage off its world class Busselton Health study."

"Business needs to be supported...by eliminating all the red tape that goes along with an application. The City needs to be innovative and supportive of local business and the vision that the business wants to go forward with."

"Encourage private infrastructure and small business initiatives, remove the excess red tape."

"Try harder to fill up all the vacant shops in town - offer incentives to new & existing businesses to rent shopfronts."

"The CBD is positively dying with cafes the only place to go. What "specialty shops" we have are few and far between with so many empty shopfronts in town. Lower rents in the city center to encourage new small businesses to start."

"Aim to provide local artisan and tourist shops that have an outlet for sale [of] local exclusive products."

"Best business is the fire station by far. I would like to see more like this, a bit sophisticated and cool."

Community Voices

"Number one priority is to lobby both state and federal governments to fix the single lane highway between Busselton and Capel."

"The dual carriage way extension from Capel to Busselton is probably outside the Council's control, and no doubt it lobbies for its completion, though that and the Bunbury bypass would make a significant difference to the accessibility of the South West, and above all safety."

"To make more effort in getting the dual carriage way completed between Capel and Busselton, before there is another fatality."

"Dual lanes from Bunbury to Busselton...need to attract tourists, from overseas and interstate so flights into Busselton and Margaret region a priority."

"Upgrade of the Busselton Margaret River airport."

"The pursuit of interstate flights is to be commended, and hopefully starts soon, as well as expanded services."

"The railway needs to be upgraded urgently to a FASTER RAIL service."

"Work towards rail from Perth via Bunbury, Busselton, Pemberton to Albany."

"Train service from Perth, Mandurah, Bunbury, Busselton Dunsborough, Augusta."

"Outer bypass to other towns eg Dunsborough & Margaret River. Caves Road is getting too clogged during tourist times & weekends."

"As the ease of reaching the area from Perth has significantly increased tourism (3 hours) the local road systems are totally inadequate ie Caves Road, Busselton to Yallingup."

"Badly need regular public transport between Dunsborough and Busselton."



Sport and recreation facilities

Community Voices

"Currently much development is occurring that benefits our tourism sector. Funding is required to support the locals in the sport and recreation space. Many grounds/facilities are at capacity as well as being older/run down. Infrastructure for these areas also requires review and work. Lack of space reduces the ability for increased participation."

"Please have a short-term plan for a Dunsborough recreation park. The existing playing fields are in TERRIBLE condition to the point where there are numerous injuries every weekend because of uneven ground. It is atrocious when we host the WCE and Freo Dockers for training camps. So embarrassing. We NEED more indoor basketball/netball courts and improved facilities for soccer, football, cricket and rugby. We are an incredibly active community that is in desperate need of decent sporting and recreational grounds."

"Leisure centre including heated pool for Dunsborough,"

"Dunsborough area has a large population of retired and older people. For health and well being purposes it is essential that the Dunsborough area has a warm water pool for exercise and pain relief."

"Better sporting facilities like more indoor basketball courts, up grade the Bovell 2 football oval so it don't flood out every season. Put basketball courts in parks so that the older kids have something to do. Old Broadwater park is so good there should be one like that in Provence, it has football goals, a wall for practicing squash or tennis and a basketball court."

"The football club rooms at Bovell are extremely outdated and are clearly getting too small for our growing community. It is at the point where it is an embarrassment to ask other clubs/towns here because of how run down they are."

"More activities for the youth like bowling alleys, wave pool to develop the young surfing talent in the region, ice skating rink, bush walking / riding trails."

"More facilities and services for youth and disabled. Everything to keep young ones developing and thriving shouldn't cost parents the earth. Not everyone can afford expensive sport and recreation."



Support is lower among renters, parents of children aged 5 years and under, people aged 18 to 34 years, people with a disability, and First Nations people.


























