The perfect location and tourism destination to host events


The City of Busselton encompasses an area of 1,455 square kilometres and is located just over 200km or 2.5 hours south of Perth in Western Australia's (WA) South West Region. It incorporates the town sites of Busselton, Dunsborough, Yallingup and Vasse which service its population of 39,623*.

Busselton is one of the fastest growing regional local government resident populations in WA. It is also the largest population centre in the Margaret River Region, and boasts some of the most spectacular natural scenery in Australia.

Getting here

Busselton is an easy two and a half hour drive south from Perth or you can sit back and catch one of the comfortable coach links. A new direct air route between Busselton and Melbourne is due to commence soon following major upgrades to the Busselton Margaret River Airport.

The City of Busselton enjoys moderate weather conditions, with an average maximum temperature of 22.1°C and an average minimum temperature of 11°C. The temperature remains in the high 20s or above between December and February.

Events Capital WA

The City of Busselton is the perfect setting for events, conferences and functions, boasting stunning natural and built facilities and venues, a dedicated events team and a captive audience made up of locals and tourists to the region. Regarded as the 'Events Capital of WA', the City plays host to a diverse calendar of events all year round which, in turn, have a positive impact on local businesses and the wider community both economically and socially. The City's annual event calendar has increased from 44 events in 2012 to 140 in 2019.

Events Support and Assistance

Sponsorship Support

As part of the City's Overall Event Strategy, an event sponsorship program is in operation, aimed to assist in the funding and attraction of year-round events to the region. Applications are open in March and September each year. Prospective applicants can contact the City of Busselton Events team for more information.

Marketing Support

We can help support and market your event via the City's social media channels - Facebook, Instagram and Twitter. The City's website includes links to the Margaret River Busselton Tourism Association event calendar as well as the City's own event calendar. A monthly community e-newsletter 'Bay to Bay' distributed to all ratepayers and customers of the City, includes an event listing.

The City has a large and small event billboard available to hire at the entrance to Busselton. The billboard is in a high volume traffic area and offers excellent exposure. Additionally, street banner space is available to hire in the City's town centre, free of charge to events held by incorporated not-for-profit organisations and charitable groups.

Logistics Support

The City of Busselton's dedicated events team work closely with event organisers to ensure each function runs smoothly from start to finish. The events team are on hand to assist with pre-event planning, navigating through local government event policies and procedures, on-the-ground support, local knowledge and contingency planning. If you would like a list of mobile food vendors, contact the City's Events team who are happy to assist.

Logistically we may be able to offer the following for events taking place on City owned reserves : waste bins, ground marking, access to electricity boxes, water, portable bicycle racks and grandstands.

Sustainability

Event organisers are provided with the City's Sustainability Guidelines which encourage organisers to take steps to be environmentally sustainable and assist in reducing the impacts of the events. The guidelines can assist event organisers to create a more mindful experience for attendees (as well as help the event organiser to save money!). The guidelines focus on the opportunities of sustainable events in the areas of waste (packaging, minimising); water (minimise single use water bottles); environment (leave no trace); transport (encouraging sustainable transport) and communication (education and promotion).

Volunteer Base

The City of Busselton is extremely proud of its committed volunteer base, for example IRONMAN WA and CinefestOZ attract in excess of 1650 volunteers annually. Volunteers are recognised and valued for their contributions and find the experience very rewarding, choosing to come back year after year.

Accessible Events

The City of Busselton prides itself in providing a high level of access and inclusion for people with disabilities and is a perfect setting for accessible events. Our events team are happy to provide information for event organisers to ensure their events can be enjoyed by everyone.

Other Support

The City of Busselton can supply letters of support to assist with applications for grants as well as link event organisers in with local bodies to assist with suppliers, accommodations needs, tourism information for the region etc.



Conference and Convention Venues

The City of Busselton has an extensive range of venues to suit all types of meetings and conferences. Below are just a few of our wide selection of venues for hire.

Busselton Performing Arts and Convention Centre (under construction)

The Busselton Performing Arts and Convention Centre will be an iconic landmark performance space with a minimum 600 seat capacity theatre and conference and convention facility to accommodate 400 people banquet style. The building will be flexible in design utilising the latest technology to fill the gap to host large indoor events, adding to the viability of the South West touring circuit and the opportunity to increase visitation to the region as a destination for conference, trade shows and conventions.



Busselton Youth and Community Activities Building

The Busselton Youth and Community Activities Building is located on the exquisite Busselton Foreshore overlooking the Busselton Jetty and delivers a practical space for youth and room hire for the community. The Building offers a multifunction room (100pax), meeting room (14pax) and office space (8pax).



Undalup Room

Located within the City's municipal building, next to the Vasse River, the Undalup Room features access to a large alfresco area and is equipped with a large commercial kitchen, high quality audio visual technology and is available in multiple configurations to suit your needs. The Undalup Room offers a total capacity of 340 persons which includes the alfresco terrace (180 pax).

Recreation and Sporting Facilities

The City of Busselton is home to a range of sporting fields capable of hosting a variety of different events. The City's Sport and Recreation Strategy 2020-2030 will see future sporting infrastructure focusing on multi-use design meaning these assets can be re-configured to assist in maintaining and attracting regional, state and national level sporting competition events as well as attracting and hosting large scale events such as music festivals alike.

One of WA's Top Tourist Destinations

With its abundance of natural and manmade attractions and close proximity to the Margaret River Wine Region, it's no wonder the City of Busselton remains one of the most popular holiday destinations in rural WA. Known for its coastline of pristine sandy beaches and rugged cliffs of the surfing coast. The beauty of the City of Busselton is not only confined to the coastline with magnificent national parks, historic lighthouses, ancient caves and eco-tourism sites on its doorstep. The City is also home to the iconic Busselton Jetty, which is the longest timber piled jetty in the southern hemisphere, measuring 1.841m long.



A Year Round Aquatic Playground

Busselton, Dunsborough, Yallingup and Cape Naturaliste are extremely popular holiday destinations offering safe swimming areas for children as well as excellent boating, fishing, diving and water sports. Yallingup is best known for its excellent surf breaks, attracting world class surfing competitions. West Australian sunsets are the best, and there is no shortage of spectacular locations to watch the sun sink over the Indian Ocean.

Having recently received a multi-million dollar transformation, the Busselton Foreshore provides the ideal backdrop and base for events.

Delivered in three stages, over a decade of development, the foreshore now boasts an Amphitheatre stage and sound shell, ovals for sporting and event use, pavilion, visitors centre and exhibition space (Railway House), youth precinct and skate park, award winning nautical themed adventure play space, jetty train toddlers' play space, seasonal market stalls, Jetty Precinct amenities and picnic areas. An abundance of parking makes the location easy to access and popular with visitors and locals alike. The design also affords easy pedestrian access through the area and roads can be closed to traffic if required.



No trip to Yallingup is complete without a visit to the epic surf breaks, The Aquarium or Injidup Natural Spa.


