## 9.1 Oxyviva equipment cylinders rental - Mark Smith

Mark asked how the volunteer claims process works for volunteers away on a DFES deployment. A YRBFB member was left out of pocket following a DFES risk cover claim for glasses that were damaged at a deployment fire.

Blake Moore will follow up with the DFES risk cover insurance and LGIS policy manager in relation to insurance of person items.

#### 10. OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY (OH&S)

# 10.1 Hazards present on the fire ground - Blake Moore

Just a reminder to be aware of hazards that can be on the fire ground or can be exposed by fire. An OH&S incident occurred with a member on the fire ground tripped on fencing wire in the middle of a burn that had been exposed by the fire.

## 10.2 Replacing PPE - Blake Moore

If members gloves or PPE is becoming warn and needing replaced please have your brigade secretary supply a uniform order through to the City and once approved by the CESM new PPE can be issued.

#### 10.3 Overhead Hazards - Blake Moore

Please remind brigade members when they are on the fire ground to ensure they are aware of their surroundings, always checking overhead for burning stags to ensure that fire fighters are not walking under trees or limbs that may fall. Additionally not to park under any trees where possible.

# 10.4 OH&S Legislation Fatigue Guidelines - Blake Moore

Just to be aware there is a new OH&S Legislation which includes fatigue management requirements, coming out that will impact on brigades, information will be provided once this occurs and is formally rolled out.

# New Prescribed Burn Plan Templates

All DFES staff and volunteers are now required to complete documentation for any burns they are undertaking.

The current basic prescription template along with supporting documentation has recently been reviewed. Several improvements were identified and have been incorporated into this new Burn Plan document package.

Where a full prescription is not required, the templates have been designed as a tool for all DFES staff engaged in prescribed burning activities to use. These templates ensure a range of considerations are addressed during the planning phase, enabling informed decision making. All volunteers engaged in prescribed burning activities are also encouraged to adopt these templates.

#### Capes and Blackwood Valley Zone Response

Both the Capes and Blackwood Valley Zone responses are active from the 1st of December, this is the second year the Blackwood is running with great success last year. The response zones enable a multi-agency response to fires which has proved beneficial in combatting fires and protecting properties.

#### Combined Pre-Season Forum

DFES, DBCA and WAPOL will be holding a combined bushfire Pre-Season Forum in December it will involve members from both the SW and LSW region participating in a day event to build capacity and networks in the lead up to the fire season.

#### Enhanced Rescue Capability for Schoolies

This year we positioned a specialised rescue vehicle at Dunsborough Fire and Rescue station. This vehicle was crewed by 2 Career firefighters from Sunday the 22<sup>nd</sup> to Friday the 27<sup>th</sup> between the hours of 1200 to 2200. The idea was to support the local volunteers in response to Road Crash. Luckily the crews weren't required however the process worked well with great support from the local volunteers.

#### • DFES COVID 19 Safe Operations Guidelines

Attached to the report is a set of guidelines to follow during incidents, it is broken down into individual checklists for different sections/activities. The main one to be aware of for all crews is on the front cover "COVID-19 safety measures to be maintained at all times"
