




Approach

The City of Busselton commissioned CATALYSE® to conduct an independent MARKYT® Community Scorecard.

Scorecard invitations were sent to 11,000 randomly selected households; 1,000 by mail and 10,000 by email. The City of Busselton provided supporting promotions through its communication channels.








The scorecard was open from 19 February to 15 March 2024 and completed by 1,363 community members with various connections to the City.

The main body of this report shows responses from local residents. As responses from the random sample (n=997) and opt-in sample (n=251) were similar, results have been combined in this report. Results from other community groups are reported separately at the end of this report.

Resident responses were weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile. Where sub-totals add to ±1% of the parts, this is due to rounding errors to zero decimal places.



MARKYT Benchmarking Excellence

Over the past 21 years, CATALYSE® has conducted community perceptions surveys for more than 70 councils across Australia. When comparable questions are asked, we publish high and average scores to enable participating councils to recognise and learn from industry leaders. In this report, average and high scores are calculated from councils that have completed a MARKYT® accredited study within the **past three years**.













Community action plans for top five priorities

Community Action Plan

Sport and recreation facilities and services

Community driven actions

- Residents are asking for more sport and recreation facilities in their respective areas, including:
 - A multisport facility incorporating indoor and outdoor courts, ovals and facilities
 - A 50m pool
 - More indoor courts (eg basketball, volleyball, squash)
 - More outdoor sporting grounds (eg hockey, football, cricket)
- Upgrade and expand the Geographe Leisure Centre.
- Upgrade existing facilities (eg Lou Weston Oval, Bovell Park) with improved playing surfaces, clubrooms, changerooms (male and female), shelter, toilets and parking.

Community Voices

"Better sporting facilities needed in Dunsborough and Busselton. With a growing population we need better facilities for our local sporting groups."

"Dunsborough is crying out for a pool, the town is growing with no offer of this facility.

Why is Dunsborough not important?!"

"Broader spread of facilities across the whole city from east Busselton, Vasse through to Dunsborough. Centralise (eg in Vasse) large expensive infrastructure such as swimming pools, basketball centre."

"More basketball courts!! The association has outgrown the 3 indoor courts in Busselton and the 1 indoor court in Dunsborough. Please provide more courts so our kids don't have to start a game at 8.30pm just so everyone can play."

"Develop a new 50m Pool and Complex in a central location like Vasse, able to service Busselton and Dunsborough communities. The old GLC is struggling and is now too old and too small."

"Future planning for a sporting precinct near Sir Stewart Bovell Oval with new basketball stadium and sporting facilities with parking."

"A long term calculated plan for a sporting complex at Vasse (central to most of the shire) incorporating swimming, squash, football."

"Increased basketball facilities. Improved facilities at Bovell Park...ground drainage, women's change rooms, exits & entries."

"Busselton Football Club requires a new building & changerooms that incorporates men and women."

"New sporting upgrades and change room facilities to be provided at all venues, within a reasonable/safe distance from the playing fields. COB needs to consult with sporting club on maintenance.. eg. watering of the ground the night before a cricket fixture, makes the pitch sometimes unplayable."

"Junior sport facilities are generally very poor. Facilities at Lou Weston and Bovell have not changed in 40 years and are an embarrassment. We have excellent participation but facilities and grounds are substandard."

"The Geographe Leisure Centre is beyond capacity, run down, badly run, unorganised and unfit for any "City". There is inadequate parking and the aquatic centre is fit for a small rural town."



Responsible growth and development

Community driven actions

- Ensure the rapidly growing population is supported with adequate infrastructure and amenities including housing, roads, schools, shops, health facilities, public transport and parking.
- Impose stricter guidelines on new developments – ensure retention of trees and green space, minimum block sizes, sustainable design principles etc.
- Ensure Dunsborough is not overdeveloped and retains its small-town feel. Limit subdivision, impose height restrictions etc.
- Provide a traffic and parking management plan for Dunsborough town centre.
- Decentralise shopping areas away from Dunsborough and Busselton – develop more satellite villages and shopping precincts throughout the suburbs.

Community Voices

"The area has grown exponentially and the services for the local community now cannot meet demand including things like rental accommodation, holiday accommodation, cafes/restaurants, parking, public transport, hospital/medical facilities and town centre".

"We do not have adequate housing or services for the current population, resulting in endemic homelessness, long wait times for services, and often poor quality of services.

I feel we need to focus on building Busselton to support its current population, rather than looking at further, unsustainable growth."

"New house developments should be more sustainable using recycled water, planting more trees so we're not left with a wasteland of big houses and no vegetation like Dunsborough Lakes."

"Recognition of the environment in local planning for growth and development. Smarter urban design - not just building more and more housing without maintaining and/or including natural spaces. This in turn will support improved mental and social wellbeing for the communities."

"Preserving the small-town vibe that we in Dunsborough came here for and visitors seek - as in other states. Keep Dunsborough's 'small town' image by not allowing building heights of more than 3 - 4 stories."

"No more high-rise buildings in Dunsborough and no more small housing developments. Stick to 1/2 acre blocks. Stop giving in to developers."

"Better town planning in Dunsborough for parking. Maybe a park and bus into town as other towns with similar parking problems have."

"Major traffic management changes in the town centre of Dunsborough to discourage vehicles in the centre of town. The current system causes congestion, especially for pedestrians, during regular hours, let alone at peak tourist times. There should be a plan to create a subsidiary centre in the light industrial area which could service the continually growing Dunsborough Lakes housing development."

"Develop more satellite communities like Vasse so people do not have to go into Dunsborough and Busselton."

"Suburbs need to have shops in them so that people do not need to go to town if they need milk. Woolworths in Dusborough should have been built over in the Lakes as that is where a majority of the population lives, instead we put it in the centre of town to add to the congestion we have on an average weekend."



Local rivers, inlets and waterways

Community driven actions

- Work together with experts and the state government to improve the health and water quality of the Lower Vasse River. Community suggestions include dredging, removing sediment, controlling algae, improving drainage, and opening the floodgates.
- Restore the river entrance into town as an attractive, usable area for recreation – for swimming, kayaks, paddleboats etc.
- Protect and conserve wetlands from further development.
- Provide a management plan for the wetlands to stop them from drying up in summer.

Community Voices

"The Vasse River needs action immediately to clean up and create a recreational river it once was. Agitate for the State Government to take over the cleanup (or Federal Government). All this red tape of permits, contracts, tenders, etc is simply mismanagement on a huge scale.

It is obvious this is bigger than a local government should be handling."

"You need to use science to fix the river. Learn from other river advisory boards such as the Swan River Trust. They have a bunch of research they are willing to share. Why pay for research when we can use others."

"The Vasse River is a disgrace. As there is less rain in the catchment area - less runoff in Vasse
- lack of flow - build up of algae. Is this affecting other councils State and Federal problem as well."

"The Lower Vasse River needs to be dredged. Much more sediment needs to be removed to have an affect on the toxic cyanobacterial blooms. Ozone nanobubble generators need to be installed and a vegetation program needs to be implemented. A long-term plan needs to be set in place to manage the Lower Vasse River."

"Please do something to clean up the Vasse River and make the entrance to town more clean and attractive."

"Make the river usable for any recreation activity, small boats, kayaks etc."

"We used to use the river for recreation and festivals.. Why is this river now so unusable.

Open the gates let the ocean do the natural cleaning."

"Please stop opening up land in wetlands. Who approved that service station behind K Mart?

What an embarrassment."

"Protecting wetlands from continual urban development."

"The smell from the wetlands in summer is disgusting and tourists are bemused that such a beautiful place can smell so terribly! It can be solved by allowing water in at a controlled rate, but isn't done. It needs to be addressed as happens every year, why?"

"Stench coming from the wetlands is atrocious during the summer period. There needs to be better management of this so they don't dry out. They have the ability to do this."



Community Action Plan

Community safety and crime prevention

Community driven actions

- · Advocate for a greater police presence:
 - more patrols on foot and bicycle especially in busy areas, in town centres and the foreshore, and on weekends, holiday periods and at night.
 - 24-hour police station in Busselton.
- Provide a community security service and increased ranger patrols, especially at night and on weekends.
- Provide more CCTV cameras and improved street lighting in parks, streets and public areas.
- Address increased homelessness throughout the City by advocating for improved access to accommodation and mental health and addiction support services.
- Advocate for the Department of Communities to better manage and support tenants who do not follow the rules.

Community Voices

"Proper police control. Police in pairs patrolling the streets not in patrol cars. Police on bicycles patrolling beach areas. Police showing themselves to be more approachable.

Preventing people begging on the streets."

"Dunsborough: More police, ie. Holiday time. Lots of kids roaming the streets. We need a Police station open seven days a week and more Police on the streets. The amount of theft occurring is becoming alarming."

"More police are needed at Busselton Police Station, although I realise this is a state issue the COB should be strongly lobbying for extra officers on patrol (on foot and bicycle) to act as a deterrent against anti-social behaviour in the city centre and beyond. Also, the opening hours of Busselton Police Station, being 8:00am to 4:00pm Monday to Friday are absolutely ridiculous given our exploding population. Police should be available on weekends and after hours, at least until 6:00 Monday to Friday."

"Introduction of community safety officers IN ADDITION to the ranger services. Trained in working together with the homeless/rough sleepers and services that support them."

"Reducing anti-social behaviour in public spaces using lighting, surveillance and partnering with local police to issue move-on notices to groups / individuals at the Mitchell Park, outside banks and at the foreshore."

"Better lighting in communal parks throughout the night in Yalyalup and patrol vehicles."

"Develop a plan to tackle existing and future crime before Busselton becomes a town like most large regional areas where crime has become out of control and other councils are 10 steps behind the criminals. CCTV improvements, 24/7 security patrols etc to work with and assist WAPOL would be a good start."

"Assist homeless people particularly those with mental health issues to find help and accommodation."

"More help for homeless people, plus people with health issues such as Addiction this can be due to medication addiction too."

"The abuse of public housing (destruction of properties themselves as well as destruction of the social fabric and foundation of the community itself). What's happening is unacceptable!!!!!"

"Stop state housing (DOC) from putting so many properties close to each other. Have a local DOC (Busselton) accountable instead of completely useless to resolving or addressing repeat offenders."

Community driven actions

- Facilitate the construction of more housing:
 - Reduce red tape.
 - Release more land.
- Encourage greater diversity in housing stock:
 - Higher density housing
 - Housing for different household sizes and life stages (e.g. singles, families, retirees)
 - Universal access housing for seniors and people with disability
 - Community housing and crisis accommodation
- Support alternative housing options:
 - Tiny houses
 - Granny flats
 - Secondary rural dwellings
 - Long-term camp sites
- Regulate the number of holiday homes and Airbnbs allowed in the local area.

Community Voices

"Housing is a massive issue for so many! There are multiple empty homes and multiple families living in cars."

"Make housing affordable to purchase or rent for families and especially those on low income."

"Affordable housing and cutting down on holiday rental properties.

People who work here need accommodation."

"People are desperate for affordable housing. It's hard to even get expensive housing. Priority needs to be placed on housing availability, land releases and building approvals."

"Try and make it easier for developments of cheaper housing to be built in the town.

Units etc. Get rid of some red tape."

"Diversity in housing stock that allows variety of options regardless budget or household size."

"Cheaper houses or flats for people who cannot afford the expensive house around the area.

In general, too many holiday homes in the area which are used just a couple of weeks
or month during the year."

"Working to advocate & attract affordable housing & higher density over urban sprawl.

Multi-pronged approach with more regulation around residential lots being used for short-term, holiday rental."

"An assessment of rental properties in the area and of Airbnb properties in the area and a change to Airbnb rules and regulations to enable more long-term rentals to become available."

"Community housing. Less empty houses. More incentive to rent out second homes to those needing housing."

"More affordable choices and allow introduction of "Tiny House" scheme."

"Greater flexibility to laws governing housing with regard to granny flats, smaller units."




Q. Over the next 10 years, which areas would you mostly like the City of Busselton to focus on improving? Base: Business respondents, excludes no response (n=212)




