BUSSELTON ROAD BOARD ELECTION (TOWN WARD)

SATURDAY, 18th APRIL, 1953

To the Ratepayers,

On Saturday, 18th April, you will be asked to elect two members for the Town Ward of the Busselton Road Board and both Mr. P. C. McMurchy and myself, who are the retiring members, are offering ourselves for re-election. As has been the case for some years, the competition is again keen and, in addition to Mr. McMurchy and myself, there are three other candidates seeking election.

I think it only fair to advise ratepayers that, with my wife and family, I shall be away for several months this year on a trip to England and the Continent. In addition to having a holiday, I will enquire into matters concerning local government and town planning overseas, which, if re-elected, I hope will be of some benefit to the Board on my return. Although I shall be away for a portion of this year, I wish to point out that the term of office for the two candidates elected is for three years, so if I am returned again I shall have plenty of time to serve the ratepayers.

My previous service with local government in the town consists of ten years as Councillor and 6 years as Mayor of the Busselton Municipal Council, 8 years as Chairman of the Water Board and 2 years as a member of the new Busselton Road Board. In the latter period, I have served as Chairman of the Board for the last twelve months.

During the next few years, your Board will be planning big things for the future and has engaged a competent town planning expert to assist.

While I am fully behind progressive moves for this thriving town and district, I feel that careful attention must be given to the financial side and hope that ratepayers will think my past experience will be of benefit to them in future planning.
