DFES LSW Region Report - 14th December 2021

DFES Regional Staff

· My Bushfire Plan enhanced for 2021/22 bushfire campaign

The 'How fireproof is your plan?' bushfire safety campaign will run again this year to raise awareness of bushfire as a personal risk and drive Western Australians to make a robust bushfire plan.

The My Bushfire Plan website and companion app launched last year have been updated with new features to make it even easier for all Western Australians to create, update and share their plan.

Resources to support the bushfire preparedness activities of volunteers and staff will be made available through the Volunteer Hub and Intranet. A General Circular will announce the release of these resources, and how to access them.

State Aerial Firefighting Fleet 2021-2022

The following information outlines the State aerial firefighting aircraft types and bases for their service period for the 2021-2022 southern bush fire season. As a result of the new aircraft contract arrangements, there is a 17% increase in suppressant delivery across the State's firebombing fleet.

Large Air Tanker (LAT):

- A National Sovereign LAT will be available for the 2021/22 season
- The LAT and lead aircraft will be considered as a National Resource and will be deployed to highest priority areas within Australia
- · The host jurisdiction and type of aircraft is yet to be determined

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) Program is a national project working to design and implement a new AFDRS. The new AFDRS will combine the latest science, experience and data to strengthen the ability of fire authorities to accurately communicate bushfire danger and improve community safety. The new AFDRS is expected to be rolled out across Australia in 2022.

· Changes to the Australian Warning System

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) is joining with other Australian States and territories to implement the Australian Warning System (AWS).

AWS delivers a more consistent approach to emergency information by using a standardised set of icons to show hazard warnings on websites and apps, supported by clear action statements to keep people safe.

The AWS is being implemented in a phased approach with the first phase implemented in September 2021.





Deployment Register.

Requests for assistance may be initiated through the Australasian Fire & Emergency Services Authorities Council, Emergency Management Australia or another State/Territory or agency seeking assistance.

DFES has established a set of procedures to follow when the deployment of DFES human resources is required, either Interstate or Internationally.

The source of the resources for deployment will be dependent on the Forecast Risk & Readiness prevailing in the various regions at the time.

The All-Hazards Deployment Register is a repository for all Expressions of Interest (EOI) in terms of names and roles that can be undertaken. All volunteer, career and staff are requested to register their EOI information via the Register. The Register is used by State Operations for planning human resources availability for deployment.

Gazetted Fire District Changes

DFES are reviewing the gazetted fire district for Dunsborough and Busselton with some changes being suggested. A map is attached for all to see and comments can be put through the CESM Blake Moore. One major change is the inclusion of the Airport into the gazetted area, this is due to the larger risk of Structural/Hazmat incidents within this area.
