8. MATTERS OF URGENCY

8.2 Allan Guthrie, Chief Bushfire Control Officer:

Concerns were raised regarding a recent fireworks event at Wise Winery.

Ian McDowell advised the City is one stakeholder in the approvals process and that it is the Department of Mines and Petroleum who have the final say. He also advised that the City would be developing an approvals process to consider future applications.

Allan Guthrie the City of Busselton follow up and provide advice on whether a Policy can be created to ban fireworks in rural property areas.

8.3 Allan Guthrie, Chief Bushfire Control Officer:

To request a mandatory fire permit meeting for all Fire Control Officers to discuss the requirements of issuing fire permits. Tim Wall will follow up on organising the meeting for late February early March 2017.

9. OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY (OH&S)

9.1 David Hunt raised concerns about drones being flown within the area of a fire ground and whether it is permitted. Danny Mosconi, Department of Fire and Emergency Services commented that if a drone is to be used in the area of a fire ground all helix tax and fix wing aircrafts must be grounded. Drones are not to be used, it was suggested the City of Busselton advertise awareness about the serious consequence of drones being used within the City within the area of a Bush Fire Emergency.

9.2 Mark Jolliffe FCO, Wilyabrup BFB:

A white ant infested tree is hanging over the Wilyabrup Brigade Station causing a safety hazard.

Matters to be discussed:

1. Sentinel Alert and Public Information

This is an update on the report presented to BFAC on 13 September 2016 regarding the Sentinel Alert System.

At its meeting of 14 June 2016 BFAC recommended that the City "conducts a survey to ascertain the level of community interest in the Capes region for a Sentinel Alert System".

A recommendation of the Special Inquiry into the January 2016 Waroona Fire, *Reframing Rural Fire Management*, was

Recommendation 11: The Department of Fire and Emergency Services to investigate and adopt a system that will allow the public to opt in, monitor and receive, through a 'push mechanism', bushfire and other emergency warnings, maps and information using a variety of devices including personal hand held smart devices.

The State Government supported the recommendation to be progressed as a priority ahead of the 2016/17 bushfire season. DFES deliverables include establishing a critical messaging system that will provide RSS feed for dissemination of:

- Warnings
- Incidents from the DFES Communications Centre
- Fire Danger Ratings
- Total Fire Bans

The *Emergency WA* website <u>www.emergency.wa.gov.au</u> has subsequently been established and allows residents to receive notifications of the information listed above.

This matter was considered at the Councillor Briefing Session on 16 November 2016. At the briefing it was determined that at this stage, due to the State Government's implementation of the *Emergency WA* critical messaging system, the City does not support a survey of residents to ascertain the level of community interest in the provision of a Sentinel alert warning system.

2. Annual Fire Inspections

The City has commenced the annual fire break inspection program with the initial focus being properties in high bushfire prone areas. As at 3 December 2016 the City had inspected 178 properties throughout the district with the following results:

- Compliant 134
- Partially Compliant 14
- Work Orders 30

This year Rangers have been assigned zones to streamline the inspection process. The City has two Rangers dedicated to conducting the inspections however, this was reduced to one during Leavers 2016. We have also experienced some technical problems with the hand held device but these have now been resolved.

3. Review of Local Emergency Management Arrangements (LEMA)

This item is for noting and the information of the BFAC.

The City's current LEMA were adopted in 2008 and are overdue for a review in accordance with current standards.

The Emergency Management Act 2005 (the Act) outlines local government's requirements to prepare and maintain Local Emergency Management Arrangements. The City has commenced a review of the LEMA and will use the State Emergency Management Committee (SEMC) Guidelines – A Strategic Framework for Emergency Management in Western Australia as the basis for the review.

Consistent with these guidelines the LEMA will be drafted in consultation with a broad range of stakeholders. The arrangements will require endorsement of the Local Emergency Management Committee (LEMC) and Council, and will be noted by the District Emergency Management Committee (DEMC) and the State Emergency Management Committee (SEMC).

2) Training

It has been a busy 4 months with training the with the following course been delivered locally

- introduction to firefighting x 3 courses
- bush firefighting x 3 courses
- Provide first aid
- Basic and Advance WAERN
- Sector Commander refresher
- Introduction to structure fire fighting
- Comprehensive crew protection training

New local 2017 training calendar attached

Comprehensive Crew protection training has been and will continue to be rolled out. This is awareness level training and it is able to be delivered by senior brigade member who have completed the training.

The training will cover

- Use burnover blanket
- Water deluge system
- In-cab air training
- Burnover survival drill

RUI Exercise

Thanks to the brigades who turn up to the RUI exercise. It was great exercise and has been put into the 2017 training calendar. Any brigades who would like me to assist them with RUI training at their training night please contact me.

3) Automatic Vehicle Location (AVL)

- all vehicles have now been fitted with AVL
- The AVL system will provide real-time visibility of appliances especially during large scale bushfires and provide automated features to support enhanced crew safety. The system is part of the State Government's \$15.4 million crew protection measures designed to help firefighters if they become trapped by fire while in their vehicles.
- The AVL system, which will be installed on firefighting appliances in the lead up to the bushfire season in the metropolitan area and high-risk southern part of the state, will help address bushfire safety by providing real-time tracking of firefighting appliances.
- An automatic alert will be generated when vehicles enter or leave defined areas. This will increase fire ground situational awareness and crew coordination.
- The AVL system also includes a distress alarm which when activated, will automatically notify the DFES Communication Centre. Longer term the alarm will be integrated into aerial equipment to allow water bombers and aerial surveillance to respond faster to distress situations.
- Access request can be found on the volunteer portal under the tab AVL, once the form has been filled out please forward it onto me
- Please don't push the distress alarm button unless you need urgent assistance.

4) <u>Security alarms at fire stations</u>

• Due to the large number of break-ins at stations I have been getting quotes to have monitored alarm systems at fire stations.

5) <u>Zone response</u>

• Has commenced on the 1st December. Updated zone response protocols and Aid memoir have been sent out to all FCO and brigades.

6) Traffic Management During Emergencies Guidelines 2015 - SEMC

7) <u>Volunteer ID cards</u>

- All brigades have been sent the link to up load photos onto DFES web site with instructions. Task a brigade member to coordinate this project, please ensure all your members are undertaking getting the id photo done.
- Once the photo has been uploaded up to DFES website the ID card will be sent to the member home address by post.
- This will be an ongoing process as new members join brigades

Attachment 7.4 Report to City of Busselton Bush Fire Advisory Committee meeting to be held on 13 December 2016

Agency: Department of Fire & Emergency Services

Officer Representing: Danny Mosconi

Matters to be discussed:

1. DFES and P&W have developed new IAPs that cover a bushfire during the initial, escalating and deescalating phases of an incident.

2. **Operations Prestart:**

Provides a tool for crews to utilise during the initial, escalating and deescalating phases of an incident.

3. IAP-LITE:

Provides an IAP template to be used while the incident is escalating or deescalating.

4. IAP:

Provides a full IAP template for complex and long duration incidents.

- Key actions from Ferguson pre-summer are:
 - All agency L3 Preformed Teams (see below regarding Local Government inclusion);
 - AVL vehicle tracking systems To date 730 vehicles have been fitted with AVL. City of Busselton completed;
 - Critical messaging Emergency WA website <u>www.emergency.wa.gov.au</u>;
 - ID Cards and Windscreen stickers Local Government managing the rollout of both of these. The intent is that these **may** assist entry through Vehicle Control Points;
 - Managing Traffic at Emergencies SEMC. New Office of Emergency Management (OEM) previously SEMC website. Key document is the SEMC Guideline "Traffic Management During Emergencies Guideline 2015
- L3 Teams WALGA has sent a letter to CEOs (and they have been briefed locally). Caches depending on capability with an emphasis on identifying shortfalls and local knowledge inclusion.
- High Season appliance should be delivered soon to Sussex and Wilyabrup
- Early in the year the Yallingup Fire Brigade identified that parking on the street in Yallingup is causing issues with access for fire trucks (and other emergency responders) in the event of an emergency. A letter was sent to the City from DFES representatives, WAPOL and St Johns in March this year highlighting this issue. Still waiting on LG response.
- Local review of 2 fires 17 local actions to come out of those. Some include Sector Commander refresher training and RUI training.
- Rural Urban Interface 4 x drills planned for LSW (Dunsborough / Nannup / Donnybrook / Pemberton)
- Exercise Commonage Multi agency exercise on Saturday 5th November with an emphasis on setting up an Operations Point. Information sharing re. ICV, DPaW Bus, USAR, CSU, WAPOL and FAWNA.
- We have hosted a number of Community Bushfire Education events in the City concentrating on the Yallingup Rural and Coastal Area
- Pre-Season Leadership Forums BFS/VFRS/SES
- DFES/WAPOL Superintendents and other Senior Officers pre-season meeting looked specifically at OEM Guidelines re Traffic Management and Community Evacuations.
- Busselton VFRS have installed a Memorial Plaque at the front of the station made from old jetty pylon which will be used to commemorate "International Firefighters Day" in May each year

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

- Blackwood District has been successful in gaining a grant under the National Bushfire Mitigation
 Program to undertake additional mechanical fuel management around Yallingup. This will further
 enhance the areas that are maintained annually around the townsite. We are currently working through
 the environmental checks with the intent to start the machine work in April/May 2017. Due to
 commitments at Fire 9 I was unable to attend the recent Yallingup Residents Association and CoB LEMC
 meetings to pass this on.
- Maintenance of the wider strategic access and firebreak network throughout the LNNP continuing.
- Busselton and Margaret River conservation employees at full employment for 2016/17 season
